EDUCATION MINISTRY REPORT

The Education Ministry Team met on February 11th and the following items were discussed:

- Small Groups - Pastor Clark asked for the team's take on the vitality of the Home Fellowship Groups. He noted that while some members are reducing participation, to some extent this is offset by newer members becoming more engaged. Johna Unger mentioned the idea of inviting new attendees to pose for Church Directory photos and including them in a subsequent revision of the document.
- Women's Ministry - President Paula Dickerson reported (1) "Created for a Purpose" training is coming up. It will be held in Birmingham, AL on Feb 22nd. Attendees are taught about fleshing out a program for girls 3rd through 8th grade to foster interest in crafts / creative projects. So far two members of WIC will be going: Mary Barton and Susan Atkins. The objective is to equip them to deliver this program to LOPC girls June 3rd - 7th. (2) On March 7th the Women's Ministry will be providing sandwiches for Habitat workers. (3) Mary Ann Johnson has volunteered to update the bulletin board. (4) Seeking child sized clothes hangers. Members are encouraged to let Paula know if they have some to spare. (5) Women's Ministry is seeking funds for holding a welcoming lunch for women who have recently joined LOPC.
- Nursery - Johna Unger reported that things are steady. No need to expand capacity currently. Sometimes grandchildren create a big surge requiring a short-term increase in nursery staff during holiday Sundays.
